to amend the Rajitlal University Bill, 2011 hereinafter referred to as Principal Bill.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Meghalaya in the Sixty-third Year of the Republic of India as follows: -

Short title and commencement.

1. (1) This Act may be called "Rajitlal University (Amendment) Act, 2012".
(2) It shall come into force on such date like principal Act.

Amendment of Section 13(1) of the principal Act.

2. The existing sub-section (1) of Section 13 shall be substituted as follows, -
"13. (1) The Visitor of the University shall be the Governor of Meghalaya."

STATEMENT OF OBJECT AND REASONS

The Rajitlal University Bill, 2011 was passed by the State Assembly on 15th September, 2011 in the Autumn Session of the Assembly in 2011 and the same was endorsed to Raj Bhavan on 30th September, 2011 for assent under Article 200 of the Constitution of India. The Government after examination decided to include the Governor of Meghalaya as its Visitor by amendment of the Principal Bill in order to maintain uniformity in respect of all self-financed private universities.
