The Headquarter of the State Swachh Bharat Mission (G) shall be at Shillong and its area of operation shall be the whole State.

The Apex Committee shall be the Governing body of the State Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) and shall meet at least twice a year or as frequently as required.

The Apex Committee could Co-opt 3 experts in the field of Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Sector as members.

The State Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) may co-opt experts not exceeding six in the field of drinking Water Communication and Rural Development, Community, Community Health and, Hygiene, Community Mobilization, Media and NGO's as members.

An Organisation by name "Meghalaya Water and Sanitation Support Organisation" (MWSSO) headed by the Chief Engineer (PHE), Environment & Sanitation, shall be merged with the **State Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) [SSBM(G)]** to deal with NRDWQM& S, MIS, IEC & HRD, etc., as explained in para 8.2.6 of the revised SBM(G) guidelines for which 100% fund is provided by the Department of Drinking Water Supply, Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India.

Functions Of The State Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) SSBM:-

1. Provide policy guidance on Water, Sanitation, Health etc.,
2. Periodic review of implementation of the MOU signed with the Deptt. of Drinking Water Supply, Ministry of Rural Development, Govt. of India.
3. Consideration and approval of sector policy and programme pertaining to sanitation sector programmes funded wholly or partially by the Government of India or External Funding Agencies.
4. Co-ordination with various Departments and other partners in relevant activities.
5. Monitoring and Evaluation of physical and financial performance and management of sanitation projects.
6. Arranging independent certification of the quality of construction of Sanitation, Solid, Liquid and Waste Management Projects.
7. Integrating and operating communication and capacity development programmes for Sanitation and SLWM.
8. The State Level Scheme Sanctioning Committee (SLSSC) constituted by the PHE Department shall be delegated with the power for according technical and administrative approval to SBM (G) Projects/ Schemes , WQM&S , MIS, Support to STA and National Expert Groups, etc., as per the State Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) SSBM Guidelines.
9. The SSBM shall identify a reputed Technical Institution designated as State Technical Agency (STA) to provide outsourced technical support to the PHED. The STA shall assist the PHED in preparing the rural Water Supply Schemes and also assist in carrying out State Specific R&D activities or any other inputs required by the PHED within the framework of the NRDWP Guidelines. The payment to the STA shall be made according to the NRDWP Guidelines.
10. The SSBM should arrange for periodic monitoring and review of the functioning of water supply and sanitation schemes by Officers, Experts, NGO's , Institution, etc., through suitable monitoring mechanism and system devolved by the State Government.
11. The SSBM shall operate programme account, Support Account and SBM (G) Account separately to receive funds from the GOI as per the Government procedures laid down from time to time and as per guidelines.

12. The SSBM shall have to furnish to the Government of India, Utilization Certificate (UC) and Audit Certificate for the funds received.
13. The Accounts of the DSBM/DSBMC /VSBC will be audited by Chartered Accountant to be engaged by the SSBM/State Government.

The DSBM (G) will have a Committee *Viz* “District Swachh Bharat Mission Committee” (DSBMC). The Members and functions of the DSBM (G) and the DSBMC are as follows.

FUNCTIONS:

- I The DWSM & DWSC shall be merged to the DSBM & DSBMC respectively.

1. To suggest appropriate procedure to adopted for effective implementation of the Community Based “Swachh Bharat Mission (G)”.
2. To sensitize the objectives, merits and modalities of the Swachh Bharat Mission (G).
3. To undertake assessment of the programme implementation and to suggest innovative and remedial action if any.
4. To consider approval of all schemes under Swachh Bharat Mission (G), which have been technically & financially scrutinized by the District Swachh Bharat Mission (G).
5. To decide about the detail designing, planning, estimation of the Sanitation/ SLWM Projects proposals, and seeking approval of the competent authority.
6. The Multi- Village Schemes under Swachh Bharat Mission (G) within a District can be approved by the DSBM (G). However, in case of such schemes covering two or more Districts, these will consider and sanctioned by the SSBM (G).
7. To open and maintain bank accounts in the State Bank of India or its associate bank for the funds of SSBM (G), which shall be known as the District Swachh Bharat Mission (G). The Member Secretary of the DSBM (G) shall be the Drawing and Disbursing Officer (DDO) for the Implementation of DSBM (G) Projects in the District.
8. To get the accounts of DSBM (G) audited annually by the Chartered Accountant.
9. To submit the audited accounts together with the Utilization Certificate (UC), received from the DSBM (G) duly signed by its Chairman and the Member Secretary to the SSBM (G) while filling claims for the subsequent installments.
10.
