6) The Monitoring Committee may invite representatives or experts from concerned Departments, representatives from Industry Associations or concerned stakeholders to assist in its deliberations depending on the requirements on issue basis.

7) The Monitoring Committee shall submit the annual action taken report of its activities as on 31st March of every year by 30th June of that year to the Central Government in the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change.

8) The Central Government in the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change may give such directions, as it deems fit, to the Monitoring Committee for effective discharge of its functions.

(1) The Governing Body shall—

(a) formulate broad policy framework, to be notified by the Government, for functioning of the Authority;

(b) formulate a policy framework, to be notified by the Government, for qualitative and quantitative monitoring and evaluation of activities undertaken from money released from the fund;

(c) approve annual reports and audited accounts of the Authority;

(d) approve annual budget and annual plan of operations of the Authority;

(e) review reports on decisions taken by the executive committee and the Chief Executive Officer, including investment decisions;

(f) monitor the progress of the utilization of monies released from the fund;

(g) accept the annual monitoring reports prepared by the Chief Executive Officer and monitoring and evaluation reports prepared by third party institutional and individual experts, if any, engaged by the Authority or the Government, with such directions as it may consider necessary to rectify and prevent recurrence of shortcomings and anomalies, if any, reported in such reports;

(i) authorize investment of surplus money in the fund which is not immediately required;

(j) approve proposals, to be notified by the Government, for delegation of financial and administrative powers to various functionaries in the Authority and

(k) do such other works as may be assigned by the Government from time to time.

Marak, MFS, whose services were placed at the disposal of Garo Hills Autonomous District Council, Tura, as Divisional Forest Officer, *vide* this Department's Notification No.FOR.12/97/Pt.I/225, dated 19th July, 2019 was transferred and posted under the following terms & conditions:-

1. Period of Deputation: - 1 (one) year with effect from 1st August, 2019 to 31st July, 2020.

2. Pay:- During the period of deputation, the Officer will be entitled to draw her own grade pay and allowances as admissible under the State Government Rules *plus* deputation (duty) allowances at 10% of the employees basic pay subject to a maximum of ₹ 4,000/- per month when the transfer is within the same station and 20% of the employee's basic pay subject to a maximum of ₹ 8,000/- per month if the transfer is outside the station, provided that the basic pay *plus* deputation (duty) allowances shall at no time exceed to ₹ 1,42,900/- or the maximum of the scale of pay of the deputation post as revised by Government from time to time.

OR

The Officer may elect the scale of pay prescribed by the Foreign Employer/Borrowing Government plus other allowances admissible under the Rules of the Foreign Employer/Borrowing Government but without the benefit of deputation (duty) allowances subject to the restriction laid down in *para* 4, 5 of Finance (E) Department O.M.NO.FE.74/72/170, dated 8th February, 1977.

3. Dearness Allowances: - The Officer will be entitled to the dearness allowance under the rules of her Parent Government or under the rules of the Foreign Employer/Borrowing Government according to her option to retain her scale of pay under the parent Government or to draw pay in the scale of pay attached to the post under the Foreign Employer/Borrowing Government.

4. Joining Time TA/DA: - The Officer will be entitled to joining time and TA/DA both on joining the post on deputation and on reversion there from to the Parent Government under the rules of the Foreign Employer. The expenditure for the purpose, will be borne by the foreign employer, TA/DA for the journey performed on tour in connection with the works of Foreign Employer will be paid by and under the rules of the Foreign Employer.

5. Leave Salary and Pension Contribution:- The Foreign Employer will be liable to pay the leave salary and pension contribution according to the prescribed rate in force from time to time, Regarding payment of leave salary, the procedure laid down in Office Memorandum No.FEG.74/72/114, dated 4th November, 75 shall apply.

6. Leave Salary during Disability Leave: - The Foreign employer will be liable to pay the leave salary in respect of any disability incurred in and through Foreign Service even if such disability manifests itself after the termination of service under the foreign employer.

7. Pension or Contribution to Provident Fund: - The Officer will not be allowed to join any pension on contributory provident fund scheme.

8. Medical Facilities:- The Foreign Employer/Borrowing Government will provide the Medical Facilities not inferior to those which the Officer would have been enjoyed in his Parent Government but for his deputation.

9. Grant of Gratuity or Pension for injury or death:- The Foreign Employer will be responsible for payment of any gratuity or pension that may be admissible under the rules if any injury is sustained or death occurs during the service under the Foreign Employer.

10. Compensatory Allowances: The whole expenditure in respect of any compensatory allowances for the period of leave during and /or at the end of services under the Foreign Employer/Borrowing Government before she joins her Parent Government will be borne by the Foreign Employer/Borrowing Government.

11. Local Allowances: - The Officer will be entitled to the local (city) allowance, house rent allowances and other local allowance according to the rules of the Foreign Employer/Borrowing Government.

12. Bonus: - The Officer will be entitled to the Bonus, if any, the rate as declared and allowed by the Foreign Employer to its employees if she opts the scale of pay of the deputation post.

13. Leave Rules: - The Officer will remain subject to leave rules applicable to the service of which she is a member.

14. Travel Concession:- The Officer will be entitled to leave travelling concession from the Foreign Employer on the scale she is entitled to under the Parent Government and the cost of such concession will be borne by the Foreign Employer.

15. Residential Accommodation:- The Officer will be entitled to the residential accommodation according to the Rules of her Parent Government or the rules of the Foreign Employer/Borrowing Government according to her option to draw her own grade pay or the scale of pay of the deputation post and the expenditure should be borne by the Foreign Employer/Borrowing Government.

16. Moveable and Immoveable Properties:- The Officer will regularly furnish returns of moveable and immoveable properties owned by her, to her Parent Government.

17. Commencement and Termination of Deputation Services:- The date of commencement of the services and deputation will be the date in which the Officer handed over charge of the post in her Parent Department/Office and the date of termination will be the date she takes over charge of the post in her Parent Department / Office as provided under Fundamental Rules and Subsidiary Rules,
