The 18th June, 2025.

No.EDN.122/2024/48. - In light of the Government's decision to conduct the Secondary School Leaving Certificate (SSLC) Examination in the month of December starting from the academic year 2025-26, the Department has received several queries and concerns. Accordingly, the Department hereby issues the following clarifications:

- Submission of Examination Forms:** Schools shall submit SSLC examination forms to the Board during the months of August and September. The detailed schedule will be notified separately by MBOSE.
- Selection Test:** Affiliated schools may determine the timing and format of the Selection Test. However, conducting a separate Selection Test is not mandatory, as schools are expected to assess students on a continuous basis through internal assessments such as half-yearly and periodic examinations. For unaffiliated schools, the District School Education Officers (DSEOs) will conduct a Selection Test, following the same pattern as implemented in 2024.
- SSLC Examination Schedule:** The SSLC Examination will commence in the second week of December and conclude on or before 19th December 2025. The detailed schedule will be notified separately by MBOSE.
- Evaluation of Answer Scripts and Declaration of Results:** Evaluation will begin after the Christmas holidays, starting from the second week of January 2026, to ensure that the festive season remains undisturbed. The results of the main SSLC Examination will be declared by the third week of February 2026.
- Supplementary Examination:** The Supplementary SSLC Examination will be conducted in March 2026, and results will be announced by the first week of April 2026, thereby allowing adequate time for Class XI academic sessions to commence smoothly.

VIII/82. - In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Meghalaya is pleased to make the following Rules to further amend the Meghalaya Prosecution Service Rules, 2016, hereinafter referred to as the Principal rules namely:-

1. **Short title and commencement** - (1) These rules may be called The Meghalaya Prosecution Service Rules (Amendment), 2025.
(2) They shall come into force from the date of Notification in the Official Gazette.
2. **Amendment of Schedule II** - In the principal rules in Sl. No. 3, the method of recruitment for the post of Administrative Officer the word "By Deputation" shall be substituted by the word "By Deputation or By Transfer".
3. **Amendment of Schedule II** - In the principal rules, in Sl. No.7 the qualification for the post of Assistant Public Prosecutor, the word "Degree in Law from a recognized University preferably with not less than 3 (three) years of experience and practice in prosecution of criminal cases in courts" shall be omitted and the word "Degree in law from a recognized University" shall be substituted.

No.UAU.81/2023/Pt/43. – In exercise of the powers conferred under the Shillong Urban Mobility Policy, 2024, the Governor of Meghalaya is pleased to notify the **Urban Mobility Cell (UMC)** under Meghalaya Urban Development Authority, aimed at supporting the seamless management and monitoring of Shillong Public Bus Transportation operations in ensuring reliable, convenient and affordable services to all. The UMC shall encompass of following members:

- i. The UMC shall be headed by Chief Mobility Officer, under the position of Deputy Secretary to the Government of Meghalaya, in charge of overall bus operations and management.
- ii. Other members shall comprise of Operations and Monitoring Officer, Information Technology System Officer, Administration and Human Resources Officer, Communications/Public Relations Officer, Finance Officer, & Procurement and Contracts Officer.

The following shall be the role and responsibility of the Urban Mobility Cell:

- i. Plan and design services through route rationalization, network optimization, infrastructure planning, and demand assessment.
- ii. Manage operations by overseeing contracts, scheduling, quality audits, and ITS-based performance monitoring.
- iii. Management of Gross Cost Contract, and related contractual framework including Service Level Agreements, Key Performance Indicators to ensure efficient service delivery.
- iv. Ensure financial oversight through revenue-expenditure tracking, KPI reporting, and mobilization of external funding.
- v. Facilitate citizen engagement *via* consultations, awareness campaigns, and grievance redressal mechanisms.
- vi. Implement Intelligent Transport Systems, including real-time tracking, digital fare systems, passenger information, and analytics.

The UMC shall function under the supervision of Secretary, Meghalaya Urban Development Authority and Director, Urban Affairs Department.

This notification shall come into force with immediate effect and shall remain in force until further orders.

1. Whereas, the issue of traffic congestion in the city of Shillong has been a matter of persistent public concern and has also been brought to the attention of the Hon'ble High Court of Meghalaya through various Public Interest Litigations. The Department has taken cognisance of these challenges and recognising their complex and multi-dimensional nature has undertaken a series of coordinated initiatives aimed at improving urban mobility and the management of public spaces. These efforts include the development of Multi Level Car Parking facilities to augment parking capacity, the introduction of Sustainable Transport and Efficient Mobility Society (STEMS) shared school bus services to reduce private vehicle usage, the proposed revamping of city's public transport system with the introduction of new fleet of buses, and the development of dedicated vending spaces and systematic removal of unauthorized hawkers from roads to restore the carriageway and pedestrian areas.
2. Whereas, despite these ongoing efforts, the demand for parking and road space in Shillong continues to outpace supply, resulting in persistent congestion highlighting the need for a structured approach to parking management in this city.
3. Whereas, to address this need, the Department has notified the Meghalaya Parking Policy for Urban Areas, 2025. The policy seeks to provide a comprehensive and sustainable framework for the regulation and management of parking in urban areas. Among its key objectives are the regulation of parking demand and ensuring optimal utilization of limited road space through several interventions including the introduction of paid on-street parking.
4. Whereas, the Department has constituted seven Zonal Task Force headed by Additional District Magistrates for the purpose of addressing parking management. In consultation with the Public Works Department and Dorbar Shnongs, the Zonal Task Forces have identified specific locations suitable for on-street parking. The process of demarcation of these zones by the competent authority is currently underway, in accordance with the provisions of the parking policy.
5. Whereas, the Zonal Task Force are also in consultation with the Dorbar Shnongs to finalize the modalities for collection of parking fee. Additionally, mechanisms for integration of technology for collection of parking fee is being discussed in partnership with GiZ.
6. Given all the above and in the interest of decongesting Shillong city, the following on-street parking fee in Greater Shillong Planning Area are hereby notified with effect from the 1st of August 2025. The period from the date of this notification till 1st August 2025 shall be utilised by the Department and Zonal Task Forces to further streamline the modalities of fee collection and sharing of the revenue. Any unauthorized collection or deviation from the notified rates shall attract penalties as per applicable laws. The Department may revise the parking fees or zone classifications from time to time based on periodic assessments. This notification shall remain in force until further orders.
