No.FOR.64/2010/Vol-I/776. - Pursuant to the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India (in Writ Petition (C) No. 202 OF 1995 - T.N. Godavarman Thirumulpad vs Union Of India & Ors - in I.A. NOS. 1868, 2091, 2225-2227, 2380 & 2568 - order dated 12th April, 2010) and as per the Direction of the Ministry of Environment & Forest, Government of India *vide* letter no F.NO.8-64/2007-FC, dated 22nd April, 2010, for the purpose of implementing and executing developmental Schemes in the area of operation by Lafarge - Umiam Mining Private Limited, "**the Special Purpose Vehicle Committee**" was notified by the Government of Meghalaya *vide* Notification No.FOR.64/2010/7 dated 6th July, 2010. Consequent upon the creation of the Special Purpose Vehicle Committee, "**the Special Purpose Vehicle Society**" has been registered under the Meghalaya Society Registration Act, 1983, with Registration No.SR/SPVS-2/12 of 2012. The Registered Office, area of operations and objectives of the Society are as per the Memorandum of the Association & Rules for Registration of the Society. The SPV Society is authorized to act as Government Society for all purposes. This Notification shall take effect retrospectively from the date the Society was registered, *i.e.* 3rd February, 2012.

No.HPL.36/2019/212. - In continuation to this Department's Notification No.HPL.179/2017/85, dated 12th June, 2018 that was issued under clause (b) of Section 17 of the Meghalaya Fire & Emergency Act, 2012, (Act No. 5 of 2012), the Governor of Meghalaya is pleased to notify that the validity of Fire NOC/Fire Clearance Certificate shall be for 3 (three) years from the date of issuance.

Random or surprise inspections may be carried out any time, with or without prior notice and any non-compliance observed during such inspections may lead to suspension or revocation of the Fire NOC/Fire Clearance Certificate.

No.HPL.52/2024/Pt-III/25. - In exercise of the powers conferred under Section 336 of the **Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (BNSS)**, pertaining to the use of documents or reports submitted by public servants, scientific experts, or medical officers as evidence in legal proceedings, the Government of Meghalaya hereby notifies the following directions for strict compliance and uniform implementation across all jurisdictions:

- 1. Deposition by Successor Officers/Experts:** In instances where the original public servant, scientific expert, or medical officer is unable to appear due to reasons such as transfer, retirement, death, or incapacity, the successor-in-office shall be deemed competent and duly authorized to depose on their behalf. The validity and evidentiary value of such reports shall be maintained unless specifically challenged by any party before the competent court or authority.
- 2. Determination of 'Dispute':** A report shall be deemed "disputed" only when a genuine and substantive challenge is raised by any party regarding the authenticity, content, or conclusions of the report. General dissatisfaction shall not amount to a dispute warranting the summoning of the original expert or officer.
- 3. Procedural Guidelines and Use of Electronic Means:** The deposition of successor officers or experts may be permitted through electronic means, wherever legally admissible, in order to facilitate timely proceedings and reduce procedural delays. All depositions must comply with established protocols to maintain legal sanctity and procedural integrity.

This Notification is issued to avoid procedural delays in criminal trials caused by absence of expert witnesses, ensure continuity in institutional evidence even after the transfer or retirement of government experts, and safeguard the rights of the accused and the integrity of the prosecution process by providing judicial guidance on disputed reports.

This Notification shall apply to all ongoing and future cases under the jurisdiction of the State of Meghalaya where Section 336 of the BNSS, 2023 is invoked. Courts, prosecution agencies and investigative officers are advised to take note of this clarification for necessary compliance.

Any existing instructions or orders inconsistent with this notification shall be deemed to be modified to the extent of such inconsistency.

No.POWER 42/2025/7. – In pursuance to the directives issued under the Electricity (Right to Consumers) Amendment Rules, 2024, the timelines to provide new electricity connection after receiving electricity connection application are detailed as below:

Sl. No.	Consumer Area	Maximum time for granting new connections from the date of submission of application
1.	Urban Area, where infrastructure is not required	7 days
2.	Rural area where infrastructure is not required	30 days

For areas where infrastructure is required, the maximum time period for granting new electricity connection from the date of submission of application would be 90 days.

No.UAU.71/2024/55. - In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 9 (4) of the Animal Birth Control Rules 2023, the Governor of Meghalaya is pleased to constitute the Local Animal Birth Control Monitoring Committee for coordinating the implementation of the Animal Birth Control Program. The constitution of the Committee is under:-

a)	Municipal Commissioner or Executive Officer of the local Authority, who shall be the ex-officio Chairman of the Committee.	Chairperson, Ex-Officio
b)	A representative of the Public Health Department of the District.	Member Ex-Officio
c)	A representative of the Animal Husbandry Department of the nearby Block or District.	Member Ex-Officio
d)	A jurisdictional veterinary doctor.	Member Ex-Officio
e)	A representative of the District Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.	Member Secretary, Ex-Officio

Functions of the Committee:- The Committee shall be responsible for planning and management of dog control programme in accordance with these rules. The committee may:

- i) Issue instructions for catching, transportation, sheltering, sterilisation, vaccination, treatment and release of sterilized vaccinated or treated dogs.
- ii) Authorize veterinary doctor to decide on case to case basis the need to put to sleep critically ill or fatally injured or rabid dogs in a painless method by using sodium pentathol. Any other method is strictly prohibited. To be decided through a sub-committee comprising of two veterinary officers and a representative of a recognised animal welfare Organisation. The subcommittee shall specify reasons in writing for euthanasia of each animal.
- iii) Creating public awareness and solicit co-operation and funding.
- iv) Providing guidelines to pet dog owners and commercial breeders from time to time.
- v) Take such steps for the purpose of monitoring the dog bite cases and to ascertain the reasons of dog bite, the area where it took place and whether it was from a stray or a pet dog. For the purpose details may be collected from Human Hospital in a requisite format.
- vi) Arrive at an estimate of the number of dogs within its territorial limits by conducting a census in the manner advised by the AWBI.
- vii) Ensure development of the infrastructure required to execute the Animal Birth Control Program for the estimated number of dogs. In order to do this, detailed project reports shall have to be prepared and submitted to the State Monitoring and Implementation Committee in coordination with the State Government.
- viii) The infrastructure shall be designed in such a manner to carry out area-wise animal birth control in a phased manner of at least 70 percent dogs in the targeted area before a new area is taken up. The infrastructure shall include, but not be limited to pre-operation preparation areas, Operation Theatres, post-op care, kennels, kitchen, store rooms for rations and medicines, parking area, residential rooms for veterinarians and attendants, quarantine ward, ambulances, etc.

No.PLR.20/2019/245. - The Governor of Meghalaya is pleased to notify the setting up of **Meg-REAP** (Regenerating Economies through Accelerated & Inclusive Enterprises in Meghalaya) **Cell**. The objective of the Cell is to function as a Project Management Unit in partnership with the Catalyst Group "Vrutti" and its associated partners and for creating an enterprise ecosystem under the three interconnected principles of equity, ecology and economy.

The Meg-REAP Cell will be housed with the Meghalaya Basin Development Authority (MBDA). The day-to-day activities of the Cell will be managed by MBDA along with partner organizations. The Cell will function under the overall supervision of a Steering Committee comprising of representatives from the State Government and members from partner organizations.

The establishment of the Cell will not have any financial implications on MBDA as all expenditures relating to the activities of the Cell will be borne entirely by the respective partner organizations.

The role and functions of the Meg-REAP Cell are as follows:

1. Community-led Governance and Economic Equity

- To empower community institutions to own, govern and benefit from enterprise value chains.
- To ensure equitable distribution of returns from markets and ecosystem services.

2. Agro-Ecological and Regenerative Enterprise Development

- To build enterprises that are ecologically balanced and locally accepted.
- To promote biodiversity conservation and climate resilience through local entrepreneurship.

3. Social Business Models and Capital Mobilization

- To develop community-partnered business models that attract private and philanthropic capital.
- To leverage appropriate mix of financing and market incentives for scalable impact.
