No.FEG.58/2024/100. - In exercise of the power conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Government of Meghalaya is pleased to make the following Rules further to amend the **Meghalaya Subordinate Treasury Accounts Service Rules, 1985** namely:

- Short title and commencement:-** (1) These Rules shall be called the Meghalaya Treasury Accounts Service (Amendment) Rules, 2025.
(2) They shall be deemed to have come into force from the date of this Notification.
- Amendment of Rule 1:-** These rules shall be called "The Meghalaya Treasury Accounts Service (Amendment) Rules, 2025".
- Amendment of Rule 2:-** In Rule 2 of the Meghalaya Treasury Accounts Service Rules, 1985 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Rules), for the existing rule, the following shall be substituted, namely:-

Definitions:- In these Rules unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context -

- "Appointing Authority"** means the Governor of Meghalaya in respect of Assistant Treasury Officer and Director of Accounts & Treasuries in respect of (i) Accountant (ii) Senior Accounts Assistant and (iii) Junior Accounts Assistant.
 - "Member of the Service"** means a member of the Meghalaya Treasury Accounts Service.
 - "Service"** means the Meghalaya Treasury Accounts Service.
- Amendment of Rule 3:-** In Rule 3 of the Principal Rules; for the existing sub-rule (1)(i) & (2), the following shall be substituted, namely:-

"Constitution of the service and status":-

- (1) (i) Members of the Meghalaya Treasury Accounts Service who are appointed by the Governor of Meghalaya and the Director of Accounts & Treasuries.

- (2) The classification of the members of Service belonging to the cadre of (i) Assistant Treasury Officer (ii) Accountant and (iii) Senior Accounts Assistant shall be Group 'B' and those belonging to the cadre of (iv) Junior Accounts Assistant shall be Group 'C'.

5. **Amendment of Rule 4:-** In Rule 4 of the Principal Rules; for the existing sub-rule (1) & (2), the following shall be substituted, namely:-

"Composition of the service"

- (1) Composition: The service shall comprise of the following four categories of posts, viz., (a) Assistant Treasury Officer (b) Accountants (c) Senior Accounts Assistant and (d) Junior Accounts Assistants appointed to the posts in the Directorate of Accounts & Treasuries Meghalaya, Shillong, District Treasuries and Sub-Treasuries.
- (2) Each of the four categories of Posts in sub-rule (1) shall form an independent cadre. Members of the lower cadre shall have no claim for appointment to any of the higher cadre except in accordance with the provision made in these Rules.

6. **Amendment of Rule 6:-** In Rule 6 of the Principal Rules; for the existing rule, sub-rules (1), (2) & (3), the following shall be substituted, namely:-

"Method of Recruitment":- Appointment to any post in the different cadres of the Meghalaya Subordinate Treasury Accounts Service shall be as follows:-

- (1) **Assistant Treasury Officer** - Promotion to the post of Assistant Treasury Officer shall be made from the select list prepared under Rule 7 from amongst the members holding the post of Accountant of the Meghalaya Treasury Accounts Service who has completed 3 (three) years of satisfactory service or a total of 13 (thirteen) years of combine service in the cadre of Accountant, Senior Accounts Assistant and Junior Accounts Assistant on the basis of seniority-*cum*-merit subject to the recommendation of the Departmental Promotion Committee.
- (2) **Accountant** - Appointment to the post of Accountant shall be made by promotion from the select list prepared under Rule 7 from amongst the members holding the post of Senior Accounts Assistants who have completed at least 5 years of service as such on the first day of the year in which selection is made, and have successfully completed the training as provided under Rule 10.
- (3) **Senior Accounts Assistant** - Appointment to the post of Senior Accounts Assistant shall be made by promotion from the select list prepared under Rule 7 from amongst the members holding the post of Junior Accounts Assistants who have completed at least 5 years of service as such on the first day of the year in which selection is made, and have successfully completed the training as provided under Rule 10.
- (4) **Junior Accounts Assistant** - Appointment to the post of Junior Accounts Assistant shall be made by direct recruitment on the result of the competitive examination to be conducted by the Commission.

7. **Amendment of Rule 7:-** In Rule 7 of the Principal Rules; for the existing sub-rule (1) & (5), the following shall be substituted, namely:-

"Procedure for selection"

- (1) (a) For the purpose of consideration of the promotion of Personnel to the level of Assistant Treasury Officer, the Departmental Promotion Committee shall consists of the following members:-

- (5) Appointment under sub-rule (1), (2) and (3) of Rule 6 shall be made from the respective lists in the order in which the names appear in the lists provided that a temporary appointment for a period not exceeding two months may be made by the appointing authority at its discretion when the approved list had been exhausted.

- 8. Amendment of Rule 8:-** In Rule 8 of the Principal Rules; for the existing sub-rule (1) & (2) (ii), the following shall be substituted, namely:-

"Appointment by competitive examination"

- (1) The competitive examination for appointment under sub-rule (4) of Rule 6 shall be conducted by the Commission at such interval as the Appointing Authority in consultation with the Commission from time to time determine and in accordance with such rules and syllabus as in Schedule-II.
- (2) Condition of eligibility - In order to be eligible to compete in the examination a candidate must satisfy the following conditions:
- (ii) Age - He must have attained the age of 18 years and not exceeding the age of 32 years on the first day of the year in which the examination is held.

Provided that in case of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes as prescribed under the Constitution of India, the upper age limit will subject to any relaxation made by Government from time to time.

- 9. Amendment of Rule 10:-** In Rule 10 of the Principal Rules; for the existing sub-rule (1), the following shall be substituted, namely:-

"Departmental Examination":-

- (1) Every person appointed to the service shall within a period of 2 (two) years from the date of appointment, appear at and pass the Departmental Examination and shall undergo successfully such training as may be prescribed by the Government from time to time.

Provided that person recruited under sub-rule (1), (2) and (3) of Rule 6 shall not be required to appear at or pass the Departmental Examination or undergo any other training if he has already passed those examinations or undergo such training before his promotion to the respective cadre.

- 10. Amendment of Rule 13:-** In Rule 13 of the Principal Rules; for the existing sub-rule (2)(a), (b), (c) & (3) (a), the following shall be substituted, namely:-

"Seniority":-

- (2) The *interse seniority* of the members mentioned under clause (ii) of sub-rule (1) of Rule 3 shall be as follows:
- (a) In the Assistant Treasury Officer Cadre, the seniority shall be determined according to the date of promotion. If two or more person are promoted on the same date, their *interse seniority* shall be in accordance with their position in the respective select lists referred to in sub-rule (2) of Rule 7.
- (b) In the Accountant Cadre, the seniority shall be determined according to their seniority in the next lower cadre.
- (c) In the cadre of Senior Accounts Assistant, the seniority shall be determined according to their seniority in the next lower cadre.
- (d) In the cadre of Junior Accounts Assistant, their seniority shall be determined according to their position in the merit list as recommended by the Commission.
- (3) The *interse seniority* of the members appointed to the different cadres of this service shall be in accordance and with provisions as mentioned under these rules.
- (a) Deleted.

- 11. Amendment of Rule 14:-** In Rule 14 of the Principal Rules; the following shall be substituted, namely:-

"Time Scale of Pay":-

The pay level as per pay matrix admissible to a member of the service shall be as shown in Schedule-III subject to revision by the Governor from time to time.

- 12. Amendment of Rule 15:-** In Rule 15 of the Principal Rules; for the existing sub-rule (2), the following shall be substituted, namely:-

"Increment":-

As per existing Government order/Rules regulating the increment.

- 13. Amendment of Schedule-I-** The existing **Schedule-I** shall be substituted by the following, namely:-

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Chief Minister's Youth Engagement Program

I. Background

- i. According to the Youth Policy of Meghalaya 2021, 85% of the State's population is below the age of 45, 74% is below the age of 35, and 59% is below the age of 25. The age group of 15-24 years alone accounts for over 8.5 lakh individuals, constituting approximately 22% of the total population. This substantial demographic segment, if provided with the right opportunities, holds the potential to become a driving force for social transformation, economic growth, and technological advancement.
- ii. In this context, the Youth Exchange Programme (YEP) of Meghalaya, initiated by the Directorate of Sports and Youth Affairs (DSYA) in 2013 was conceived as part of the "*Meghalaya Year of the Youth*" initiative. The programme was launched to provide a dynamic platform for young people to share knowledge, experience diverse cultures, and build mutual respect while nurturing leadership qualities and creativity. Initially conducted in collaboration with the Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan (NYKS), Shillong, the programme began with youth camps that brought together participants from different regions of the State for cultural and leadership activities.
- iii. The first State-level Youth Exchange Programme was organised in 2014, where youth from across the state of Meghalaya engaged in a camp where the participants were introduced to competitive events such as folk dance, folk song, quiz, poetry, painting, storytelling, and declamation, along with non-competitive activities such as adventure sports, talent shows, and traditional games. Following the State-level programme, selected participants were nominated to represent Meghalaya at National Youth Exchange Programmes organized in different states of India. Since 2015, the DSYA has independently managed the State-level programmes, while continuing to collaborate with NYKS and Bharat Scouts and Guides for national exchanges and with international organisations for the international exchanges.
- iv. The ongoing Youth Exchange Programme (YEP) is designed to empower young people through knowledge sharing, cultural exchange, and mutual respect. The programme serves as a transformative platform, enabling youth from across the State to gain exposure to diverse traditions, explore new perspectives, and develop the confidence to represent Meghalaya at the regional, national, and international stages. Presently, the programme operates at four tiers—District, State, National, and International. It begins with district-level activities to identify promising youth through cultural, intellectual, and adventure competitions. Selected participants advance to the State Level for competitions, cultural exchange, leadership workshops, and thematic awareness sessions. Top performers then join National level programs for inter-state interactions and exchanges, while the International Exposure Programme offers a select few the opportunity to travel abroad, learn from other cultures, and showcase Meghalaya's heritage on the global stage.
- v. Over the years, the YEP has achieved notable success. At the State Level, participation has grown to nearly 600 youth annually, fostering inter-district unity and cultural pride. At the National Level, Meghalaya has been prominently represented in exchanges to Delhi, Sikkim, West Bengal, Nagaland, Arunachal Pradesh and many other states of India. In 2024, the State excelled at the 7th Northeast Youth Festival in Tripura, securing top positions in several cultural competitions. At the International Level, delegations from Meghalaya have showcased the State's heritage in Singapore, Hong Kong, Bhutan, and Indonesia, Vietnam, earning widespread appreciation for their performances and cultural diplomacy.

II. Revitalization of the Youth Exchange Program (YEP)

- i. The YEP has had a transformative impact on the youth of Meghalaya. It has provided opportunities to the youth of the state to interact, foster a sense of unity and mutual appreciation. It has nurtured latent creativity, built confidence, enhanced communication skills, and developed leadership qualities among participants. By offering exposure to art, craft, music, language, lifestyle, and cultural heritage, the programme has successfully channelised the energy and potential of Meghalaya's youth into constructive pursuits. Over the years, approximately 7500+ youth across the state have been directly engaged in the YEP across all levels (District, State, National and International).
- ii. Recognising the programme's impact and its potential for even greater outreach, the Government of Meghalaya now seeks to revamp and relaunch the initiative as the Chief Minister's Youth Engagement Program (CM-YEP). The restructured programme shall adopt an expanded framework, starting from the Block Level and progressing through the District, State, National and international levels. With an aim to bring more than 12000 youth from across the state annually under its purview; this enhanced structure is intended to ensure equitable access to opportunities for youth across all regions of the State, including those in remote areas. While earlier editions have been successful, this expansion shall ensure participation from every block, thereby creating an inclusive and representative platform that truly engages the youth at the grassroots and prepares them for leadership roles in a rapidly evolving world.
- iii. Alongside cultural exchange and leadership opportunities, the revamped CM-YEP shall also place strong emphasis on career counselling, skill development, and entrepreneurship training. Through this holistic approach, the programme aims to empower young people with practical knowledge, future-ready skills, and innovative mindsets required to thrive in today's dynamic world. By integrating capacity-building workshops, mentorship from industry experts, and exposure to entrepreneurial ecosystems, the initiative aims to nurture self-reliance and open pathways for employment and enterprise creation. This focus ensures that the programme is not only a platform for cultural and social engagement but also a catalyst for sustainable economic empowerment of Meghalaya's youth.

III. Objectives of the Program

- i. Expand Grassroots Participation - To extend the reach of the programme ensuring equal opportunities for every youth.
- ii. Cultural Exposure & Integration - Enable youth to experience diverse cultural practices, languages, cuisines, art forms, and lifestyles across regions.
- iii. Skill Development - Build leadership, communication, and life skills through structured activities and thematic sessions.
- iv. Representation and Collaboration - Facilitate inter-block, inter-district, interstate, and international relations for long-term collaboration.
- v. Promotion of Meghalaya's Heritage - Showcase local traditions, innovation, and youth talent to wider audiences.
- vi. Youth Empowerment - Prepare youth to be ambassadors of Meghalaya at national and global platforms.

IV. Structure of the Program

i. The structure of the CM-YEP is as follows:

Note: Above numbers are only indicative. Bigger blocks/districts are to mobilize/select more participants as compared to smaller blocks/districts, as the case may be.

V. General Terms and Conditions

- i. For the purpose of this scheme, districts of Meghalaya with more than four (04) blocks under their jurisdiction shall be classified as bigger districts, while those with four or fewer blocks shall be classified as smaller districts (Annexure A).
- ii. Programs for participation at National and International levels may be divided into batches. Each batch of participants must be escorted by at least two (02)

escorting officers (01 male and 01 female) designated by the Directorate of Sports and Youth Affairs, Meghalaya

- iii. Gender parity needs to be maintained in selection of participants at all levels. In National and International levels equal numbers of males and females are to be selected for participation.

VII. Eligibility Criteria

The person must be:

- i. Between 15 to 29 years of age (18+ for International Level only) having valid domicile proof of Meghalaya.
- ii. Medically fit to participate in the event.
- iii. Must not have any past or ongoing criminal record.

2. "Rules and Orders" means the Criminal Rules and Orders framed by the High Court of Meghalaya;
- Amendment of rule 3**
3. The Courts shall generate and issue process in electronic mode through CIS in such forms as set forth in the Second Schedule of the Sanhita, with such variations as the circumstances of each case may require and the same may be directed to be served by an authorized police officer, of an officer of the court issuing it or other public servant as directed by the Court.

1. Legal References.

- a. **Section 111** - Organised Crime: Defines criminal acts committed by syndicates, including:
 - i. Contract killings, extortion, drug/human trafficking, land grabbing, cybercrime, kidnapping.
 - ii. Punishment: Minimum 5 years to life imprisonment or death (depending on consequence).
- b. **Section 304** - Snatching: Defines snatching as the sudden taking of movable property from a person's body.
 - i. Punishment: Up to 3 years; upto 7 years with injury.

2. Initial Response.

- a. Make General Diary entry.
- b. Register FIR immediately upon receiving complaint or credible input.
- c. For Section 304 cases, verify whether it is:

- i. A stand-alone snatching,
 - ii. A series of snatchings, or
 - iii. Possibly linked to an organised network
 - d. For Section 111 cases:**
 - i. Report immediately to senior officers.
 - ii. Add related sections as required (NDPS, Arms Act, IT Act, etc.).
- 3. Crime Scene Management**
 - a. Secure the scene.
 - b. Conduct detailed crime scene documentation and video recording.
- 4. Victim Support**
 - a. Record statement of victims.
 - b. Arrange medical examination if injuries are present.
 - c. Provide psychological support to vulnerable victims (elderly, minors, women).
- 5. Evidence Collection**
 - a. For snatching cases:
 - i. Recover phones, bags, chains via tracking or seizures.
 - b. For organised crime cases:
 - i. Forensic analysis of digital devices.
 - ii. Scrutiny of financial transactions.
 - iii. Link snatching or other cases if multiple FIRs indicate same modus operandi.
- 6. Investigation Procedures**
 - a. Develop a case-specific investigation plan within 24 hours of FIR.
 - b. Identify criminal network through link analysis. CDRs, IPDRs, financial records and CCTNS data.
 - c. Interrogate suspects and associates systematically and corroborate statements with digital/forensic evidence.
 - d. For organised crime cases, prepare a comprehensive charge-sheet reflecting syndicate hierarchy, funding sources, and modus operandi.
 - e. Ensure compliance with timelines for investigation and submission of final report.
- 7. Arrests & Custody**
 - a. Arrest suspects promptly.
 - b. For organised syndicates, prioritise leaders and repeat offenders.
 - c. Seek custodial remand where necessary.
 - d. Record Section 183 BNSS statements before the Magistrate.
- 8. Witness Protection**
 - a. If witnesses are at risk:
 - i. Apply for protection under State Witness Protection Scheme.
 - ii. Use audio-visual recording during evidence collection.
- 9. Documentation**
 - a. Prepare and maintain:

- i. FIR copies, seizure memos, medical reports, etc.
- ii. Victim/witness statements,
- iii. Scene documentation.
- iv. Maintain chain of custody for all evidence.

10. Supervision and Monitoring by Superintendent of Police

- a. The Superintendent of Police (SP) shall:
 - i. Review all FIRs registered under Sections 111 and 304.
 - ii. Hold weekly case review meetings with Investigating Officers (IOs) and Circle Officers.
 - iii. Ensure that investigation timelines are strictly adhered to, particularly in organized crime cases.
 - iv. Scrutinise charge-sheets before submission to ensure quality of evidence and legal soundness.
 - v. Coordinate with specialised agencies (ATS, Cyber Cell, NDPS units) wherever required.
- b. Any delay, lapse, or negligence in investigation shall be reported to higher authorities with specific recommendations for remedial measures.
