No.UAU.5/2017/Pt.IV/91. - In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 21 of the Street Vendors (Protection of Livelihood and Regulation of Street Vending) Act, 2014 (Central Act 7 of 2014), and subject to the provisions of this Act or any rule or scheme made thereunder, and in compliance with the order issued by the Hon'ble High Court of Meghalaya in PIL No.17/2021, dated 28th October 2024, which directed the State Government to demarcate areas where street vending can be allowed or otherwise.

The Town Vending Committee (TVC) was formed under Section 22 of the Street Vendors (Protection of Livelihood and Regulation of Street Vending) Act, 2014. The Urban Affairs Department prepared the street vending plan which was discussed and accepted in the Town Vending Committee meeting held on 10th February 2026, in consultation with the street vendor associations.

The **Street Vending Plan for Laitumkhrah** identifies the following three locations for regulated street vending: (i) Fire Brigade Road, (ii) Near Lyndhurst Estate, and (iii) Near DHS. The Street Vending Plan for Laitumkhrah is attached herewith.

The Government of Meghalaya, in compliance with the Hon'ble High Court order referred above, hereby notifies the Street Vending Plan for Laitumkhrah and accepted by the Town Vending Committee. This notification is issued for the information and compliance of all concerned.

In view of the above, the remaining areas of Laitumkhrah are hereby declared as '**No Vending Zones**'.

No.UAU.5/2017/Pt.III/435. - In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 18 of the Street Vendors (Protection of Livelihood and Regulation of Street Vending) Act, 2014 (Central Act 7 of 2014), and subject to the provisions of this Act or any rule or scheme made there under, and in compliance with the order issued by the Hon'ble High Court of Meghalaya in PIL No. 17 of 2021, dated 28th October, 2024, which directed the State Government to demarcate areas where street vending can be allowed or otherwise, **the entire stretch of road from Bank Point to Red Cross Point along Civil Hospital Road is hereby notified as a "No Vending Zone" with immediate effect for smooth traffic flow and public convenience.**

All street vending activities are prohibited in the specified area. Non-compliance will result in penalties as per the provisions of the Meghalaya Street Vendors Scheme (Protection of Livelihood and Regulation of Street Vending), 2023.

No.LE&SD.132/82/Pt./Vol.I/164. - In continuation to Meghalaya Government's earlier Notification No.LL.(B) 129/93/18, dated 10th March, 2004, and in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 29 of Meghalaya Shops and Establishment Act, 2003 and other powers enabling him in this behalf, the Governor of Meghalaya is pleased to exempt all establishments from the provisions of Section -6 of the said Act and permits all the establishments registered under the Act in the State of Meghalaya to keep open on all 365 days of the year, for a further period of 1 year *i.e.*, up to 31st December, 2026, unless it is revoked, subject to the following conditions namely:-

- i. This exemption shall remain in operation for the period of one year from the date of Notification published in Government Gazette,
- ii. Every employee working in the establishment shall be given one day holiday in a week without making any deductions from his/her wages on account thereof and list of the time table of such holidays for a month shall be placed on the notice board in advance.

This condition is exempted for the industrial employees of the Printing & Stationery Department, Government of Meghalaya and they are to work beyond normal working hours, including Sundays and holidays only for the period of 19 days with effect from 9th February, 2026 up to 27th February, 2026 in view of the Budget Session, of the Meghalaya Legislative Assembly, 2026.

- iii. Every employee shall be given a rest period of one hour after 5 hours of continuous work.
- iv. No employee shall be required to work for more than 9 hours in a day or 48 hours in a week.
- v. If the establishment remains open after 10:00 P.M. on any day, adequate safety and security arrangements shall be ensured for employees and visitors,

- vi. As establishments are being given permission to be open for all days, new staff shall be appointed for the extended timing.
- vii. Female employees shall be provided separate locker, security and rest rooms at the work place.
- viii. Every employer employing women employees shall constitute Internal Complaint Committee against sexual harassment of women under the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (Central Act, 14 of 2013) and the said Committee shall be operative.
- ix. If female employee(s) is/are required to work after 7:00 P.M, her/their written consent in this regard shall be taken. Adequate safety and security arrangements of female employees shall be made during working hours and it shall be ensured that they safely reach home after their work is over.
- x. The Prevention of The Child and Adolescent Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act 1986, as amended from time to time, shall be implemented in the establishments.
- xi. The employees shall be provided all the facilities mentioned in the relevant labour laws.
- xii. Consent letter shall be taken from the employees and it should be kept as record in the establishments.
- xiii. The spread over of an employee shall not exceed 11 hours in a day.
- xiv. Employee shall be given national and festival holidays with wages.
- xv. The wages including overtime wages of the employees shall be credited to their saving bank account,
- xvi. In addition to these terms and conditions, all the provisions of the Act and other relevant Laws shall be applicable to the establishment.
- xvii. In case of violation of any of the above terms and conditions or any other provision of the Act the exemption shall be cancelled after giving a due opportunity of being heard by the Competent Authority.

This Notification is in supercession of Notification No.LE&SD.132/82/Pt/Vol.1/147, dated 25th August, 2025.

This will come into immediate effect and until further orders.

No.EDN.9/2026/7. - The Governor of Meghalaya is pleased to notify the introduction of a Structured Pay Framework (SPF) for fixed-pay teachers under the Education Department, with effect from 1st April, 2026, with the objective of ensuring a transparent, equitable, and sustainable remuneration system while providing social security, strengthening service conditions, and enhancing administrative efficiency in the school education sector.

1. Applicability

The Structured Pay Framework shall apply to the following categories of teachers presently receiving fixed remuneration under various grants and arrangements:

- (1) SSA Teachers (LP & UP).
- (2) RMSA Teachers (Secondary & Higher Secondary).
- (3) Adhoc Teachers (LP, UP, Secondary, Higher Secondary, Secondary Morning/Night).
- (4) 4th Teachers (UP).
- (5) Science Grant Teachers (Secondary).
- (6) Hindi Grant Teachers (Secondary).
- (7) Pre-Primary Teachers (Pre-school) *vice* conditions, and enhancing administrative efficiency in the school education sector.

2. Components of the Structured Pay Framework

The Framework shall consist exclusively of the following components:

- (1) Base Pay, fixed based on verified years of service;
- (2) Composite Annual Increment (CAI) at the rate of 3% of Base Pay; and
- (3) Centralised Provident Fund (CPF) with contributions of 8% by the Employer and 8% by the Employee.

The approved Structured Pay Framework is annexed herewith at Annexure-1. Provided that there shall be performance appraisal of teachers by Headmaster/Headmistress/Principal for the purpose of granting Composite Annual Increment (CAI).

3. Service Protection

SSA and RMSA teachers shall be provided continuity of service up to the age of superannuation (58 years), subject to satisfactory performance, medical fitness, and compliance with prescribed service conditions. Such continuity shall not be construed as regularisation or conferment of Government employee status.

4. Formal Agreement

Teachers covered under this Framework shall not claim parity with Government Pay Scales or allowances. All such teachers shall execute a formal agreement with the designated authority (SDSEO for LP & UP teachers; and DSEO for Secondary and Higher Secondary Teachers) as a condition of their engagement under the Framework.

5. Role of State Education Mission Authority of Meghalaya (SEMAM)

The State Education Mission Authority of Meghalaya (SEMAM) shall be responsible for:

- Managing and disbursing salaries under the Framework;
- Executing agreement with teachers;
- Maintaining CPF accounts; and
- Undertaking related administrative functions.

The Memorandum of Association (MoA) of SEMAM shall be amended accordingly wherever required.

6. Direct Bank Transfer

Pay of SSA and RMSA teachers, including 4th Teachers, shall be credited directly to their individual bank accounts. For other categories of teachers, pay shall be released directly to individual bank accounts only upon receipt of a No Objection from the concerned School Management Committee (SMC); otherwise, the pay shall continue to be released to the SMC account as per the existing practice.

7. Rationalisation of Schools and Teachers

The Government reserves the right to rationalise the schools and teachers to ensure optimal teacher-student ratios and efficient utilisation of human resources.

8. Power to Issue Guidelines

The Education Department may issue detailed guidelines, operational instructions, pay fixation methodology, and agreement formats for effective implementation of this Notification.

9. Interpretation

In case of any doubt regarding interpretation of this Notification, the decision of the Education Department, Government of Meghalaya, shall be final.

No.AGRI(E)178/95/211. - In continuation to this Department's Notification under reference, I am directed to inform you that the terms and conditions of deputation of Smti. Mariana Dkhar, Joint Managing Director, MgSFAC, Shillong with effect from **6th May, 2025** are as follows:-

Terms & conditions

1. Pay and Deputation Allowances: During the period of deputation, she may elect to draw either her own grade pay or pay of the deputation post. If she elects to draw her own grade pay and allowances in her parent department, she will be entitled to draw the deputation (Duty Allowances @10% of her basic pay subject to a maximum of ₹ 4000/-p.m as per O.M. No.FEG.9/2018).

OR

She may elect to draw the scale of the deputation post prescribed by the Corporation plus other allowances under the rules of the Corporation by without the benefit of the deputation (Duty Allowance). Subject to the restriction as laid down under para 4.5 of Finance (Estt). Department O.M. FEG.74/72/365, Dt. 17.08.2010.

2. Dearness Allowance, etc During the period of deputation under the Corporation she will be entitled to D.A. under the rules of her parent Department or under the rules of the Corporation according to her option to draw either her own grade pay in her parent Department or the pay of the deputation post under the Corporation.

3. Joining time T.A/D.A The Officer will be entitled to joining time and TA/DA both on joining the post of deputation and on reversion there from to the parent Department under the rules of the Foreign Employer. The expenditure for the purpose will be borne by the Foreign Employer. T.A./D.A. for journeys performed on tour in connection with the work of the foreign employer will be paid by and under the rules of the foreign employer (in case of deputation to other State Government including Government of India joining time pay and T.A. will be regulated as per provision laid down in Appendix 3-B of Account CodeVol.I).

- 4. Leave Salary of Pension Contribution** The Foreign Employer will be liable to pay the leave salary and pension contribution according to the rate in force from time to time. Regarding payment of leave salary, the procedure laid down in O.M. No.FEG.74/72/114, dated 4th November, 75 shall apply. (In case of deputation to other Governments; including Government of India, General Principles as laid down in Account Code Vol-I shall apply.)
- 5. Payment of leave Salary during disability leave** The Corporation will be liable to pay the leave salary in respect of any disability incurred in and through service under Corporation and even if such a disability manifests itself after the termination of service under the Corporation.
- 6. Pension or Contribution Provident Fund** The Officer will not be allowed to join any Pension or Contributory Provident Fund scheme.
- 7. Medical facilities** During the period of deputation, she will be entitled to medical facilities not inferior to those which she would have enjoyed in her parent office but for her deputation.
- 8. Grant of Gratuity or Pension for injury or death.** The Corporation will be liable to pay any gratuity or pension that be admissible under the rules if any injury is sustained or death occurs during the service on deputation to the Corporation.
- 9. Compensatory Allowances** The whole expenditure in respect of any compensatory allowance for the period of leave during, and/or at the end of the services under the Foreign Employer/borrowing Government before she joins her parent Government will be borne by the Foreign Employer/borrowing Government i.e. the Corporation.
- 10. Leave Rules** During the period of deputation, she will be governed by the leave rules applicable to her to the service of which she is a member.

- 11. Leave travelling concession** During the period of deputation under the Corporation, she will be entitled to L.T.C. on the scale she is entitled to her parent Department and the cost of such concession will be borne by the Corporation.
- 12. Residential Accommodation** During the period of deputation under the Corporation, she will be entitled to residential accommodation under the rules of her parent department or the rules of the Corporation, according to her option to draw either her own grade pay in her parent department or the pay of the deputation post and the entire expenditure will be borne by the Corporation.
- 13. Moveable & Immoveable properties** The Deputationist concerned will regularly furnish returns of her movable and immovable properties owned by her to her parent department.
- 14. Commencement & Termination of Deputation Services** The period of deputation of the officer concerned under the Corporation will be normally for a period of 1(one) year with effect from the date of assumption of duty and the date of termination thereof will be the date she resumed charge of any post under the parent Department as provided in the Fundamental Rules and Subsidiary Rules.
